

Troodon was bird-like dinosaur, so it laid eggs. In the case of some modern birds eggs are brooded by males. Troodon father also could have brooded his eggs.

Since females use a lot of calcium to make egg shells, the bones of females usually have cavities. The skeleton which was found near a clutch of troodon eggs does not have that feature. Therefore it probably belongs to male troodon.

Troodon eggs and nests were found in Montana.
